## Aesthetics

### GINGIVAL FRAME: AN INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

Respect for the Gingival Frame understood as the ensemble of marginal and deep periodontal tissues—certainly represents one of the crucial elements for the success of any rehabilitation involving the aesthetic area. The aim of this presentation is to analyze strategies for managing the Gingival Frame, identify the factors that influence its biological and aesthetic stability, and emphasize the need to adopt an interdisciplinary approach. Clinical and biological parameters that determine conditions of health or disease will be examined, together with situations requiring more advanced management through various periodontal surgical techniques. At the same time, aesthetic and functional parameters will be analyzed, along with different techniques for preparation and design of restoration margins, with the goal of reducing invasiveness, improving long-term clinical outcomes, and decreasing the incidence of complications. Proper management of the Gingival Frame integrating treatment planning and biological control of soft tissues with targeted surgical-prosthetic protocols can predictably enhance aesthetics, biological stability, and the longevity of dental rehabilitations.
